


Criminal Violence


Table 1: Respondents Who Answered "Yes" to the Respective Security Question	(2008)	(2010)

Does the presence of the police make you feel safer?	89.00%	62.80%


Resurgence of Armed Groups



IDP Camps

- Number of displaced people: 2 million
- Number of people in spontaneous settlements: 1.3 million
- Number of people living with host families: 5-600,000





HNP and Justice System

- Number HNP officers dead: 77
- Number HNP officers severely injured: 253
- Post-Earthquake reduction in HNP force : Over 50%
- Percentage of HNP vehicles damaged: 65%
- Percentage of IDPs who report rarely or never seeing the HNP or MINUSTAH: 75%
