ROYAL NORWEGIAN EMBASSY

The Royal Norwegian Embassy

Norway established its first embassy in Washington, D.C., on October 31 1905. Strong historical ties link Norway and the United States. Between 1825 and 1940, more than one-third of Norway's population

immigrated to America. As allies since the two nations fought together in World War II and were co-founders of both the United Nations and the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO). Today, the Embassy in Washington is Norway's largest, with a staff of around 50, including representatives from a number of Norwegian ministries. Norway has taken a lead in a number of global initiatives from peace processes in countries like Sudan or Sri Lanka, global health issues like MDG 4 and 5 and in the promotion of UNSC Resolution 1325 on Women, Peace and Security. The US and Norway are partners on many of these issues, and they are thus an important part of the bilateral relationship and the Embassy's daily work.
